Apply the basic components of backward design and text and task analysis to improve lesson planning

## **Scaffold Rigorous Texts**

Learn to implement instructional strategies and routines to help all students understand complex text

## **Support**

Learn strategies for differentiation to facilitate comprehension of core content texts for multilingual learners across levels of English language proficiency (I-ELD)

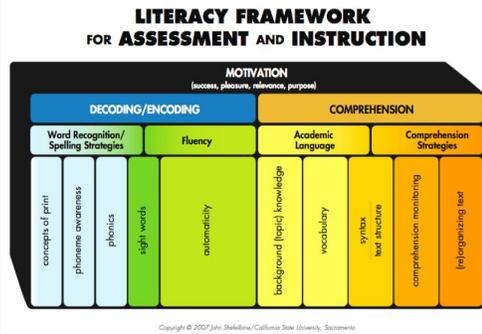
## **Encourage**

Improve motivation and engagement for students to successfully and independently comprehend complex text in all content areas

## Efficacy

By giving students the right reading "tools," they build the "**I can do this**" mindset. Success builds confidence!

## Relevance

We connect texts to topics students care about. When kids see value in what they read, they work harder to understand it!

## Purpose

Students learn that growth comes from deliberate practice and smart strategies. They see that their own hard work leads to success.

# Our Progress So Far



## Coaching

Coaches are available to help teachers include the 10-step process in their daily lessons.



## Resources

We created a website where teachers can share and find planning tools.



## Leadership

Principals have met with CRLP experts to learn how to help our staff.

# 10-Step Instructional Flow: Before, During, and After Reading



## Before Reading

Before students encounter a text, teachers focus on:

- Analyzing the text for relevance, demands, and objectives.
- Setting a clear purpose for reading to share with students
- Building vocabulary words
- Planning what students will *do* to show they understand

# 10-Step Instructional Flow: Before, During, and After Reading

## 🔍 **During Reading**

Students learn to "drive" their own learning. They monitor their own understanding while they read.

## ✓ **After Reading**

Students use routines and strategies to check what they learned and connect it to the core content.

**New training on these steps began January 5!**

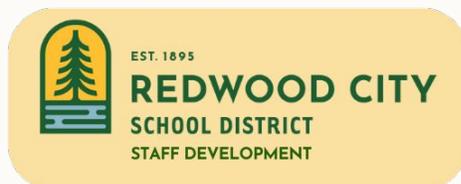
