The Board took action in closed session by a unanimous vote to adopt the neutral fact finder's report issued on June 3, 2026 regarding the reduction in hours of classified librarian positions. This Report recommended the District's last best offer as a settlement of these negotiations. The factfinder report is available to the public and copies are here tonight.

Since the impasse process has now been exhausted, the District will, as allowed by law, implement the recommended reduction in hours on the first workday in August of the 2026-2027 work year for affected employees.

The District will continue to meet its legal obligation to negotiate the effects of this reduction in hours should CSEA request to do so.
